

#### Dear Parishioners,

"Forever" is a very long time! So long, in fact, that it is not measurable. For little children, "forever" is as long as it takes for their birthday party to begin. For youth, "forever" is as long as it takes for them to be able to drive on their own. For adults, "forever" is as long as it takes to pay for a home, achieve job security, or have a well-funded 401(k). Still, these "forevers" are measurable ... time passes. In this weekend's Gospel, Jesus asserts twice (at the beginning and at the end) that "whoever eats this bread will live forever." This forever is not a measurable forever and cannot be grasped by passing time. This forever is Life in communion with Jesus Christ ... with God ... that never ends. This Gospel presents in a most astonishing way how we participate in Jesus' forever ... in eternal Life. It also presents, in a most astonishing way, the very core of the mystery we celebrate today ... Corpus Christi ... the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ ... the mystery of Jesus giving us His Flesh and Blood as our eternal food and drink.

Jesus' declaration that He is the "bread that came down from heaven" grounds His further declaration that those who eat "this bread will live forever." Heaven is a state of forever. Those who eat the One come down from heaven will be like He is – in a state of forever. This lofty promise is no pie-in-the-sky dreaming. It is real because Jesus Himself has passed from this life to eternal glory. His humanity has risen and now lives forever. It is this risen humanity that is our nourishment for eternal Life.

Jesus is the divine Word made flesh – a flesh and blood now given to us for food and drink so that we live in communion with Him. The Greek word for "flesh" in this Gospel is the same Greek word (*sarx*) that the evangelist Saint John uses to describe the Incarnation: "*And the Word became flesh and made His dwelling among us ...*" (John 1:14). Saint John suggests a parallel between Jesus' coming down from heaven at the Incarnation and Jesus coming down from heaven at the Eucharist. Both cases of "coming down" require self-emptying ... self-giving. The core of the mystery of the Incarnation is the Son's self-giving that is our salvation. The core of the mystery of the Eucharist is the Son's self-giving that is our eternal Life. Incarnation and Eucharist are two sides of the same mystery of Jesus' self-giving.

The Gospel for this weekend makes clear to us that Jesus gave Himself over and over: at the Incarnation, in the self-sacrifice on the Cross, in the self-giving of His very Flesh and Blood as food for us to eat and drink that brings us to eternal Life. Jesus' self-giving is eternal Life-giving for each one of us who believe, who have faith, and who follow.

It is no coincidence that self-giving is a necessary constituent of Eucharist – both in terms of Jesus' giving Himself as food for us and our giving ourselves to one another for the common good. It is also no coincidence that Eucharist is a share in the eschatological messianic banquet ... in other words ... the eternal banquet in heaven. Eucharist eloquently spells out the Paschal Mystery – self-giving (dying) and messianic banquet (rising). Eucharist nourishes us and gives us the strength to choose self-giving sacrifice as a way of living, and this is the only way to achieve eternal Life. No wonder we Christians ... we Catholics ... call ourselves a eucharistic people, and no wonder Eucharist defines who we are as those baptized into Christ. By sharing Eucharist ... by sharing in Jesus' Flesh and Blood, we share in His Cross and Resurrection.

May Saint Michael the Archangel defend, guide, protect, and intercede for us always! May you and your families be well and safe on this day commemorating the Eucharist ... Corpus Christi ... the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ!



## June 11, 2023 | Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

Dt 8:2-3, 14b-16a | 1 Cor 10:16-17 | Jn 6:51-58

#### GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ, the true, real, and substantial presence of Jesus Christ under the appearances of bread and wine. As Catholics, we know that the Eucharist is not simply symbolic, but is in fact the body, blood, soul, and divinity of Christ who rose from the dead. Our readings remind us of this. In the Gospel Jesus says: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh ... I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you." Although Jesus' words were very difficult for his disciples at the time to understand, we know that the bread and wine that become the body and blood of Jesus satisfy our deepest hunger. This spiritual food is actually an encounter with God through his Son, Jesus. It is a blessing that the Church provides us. Let us celebrate on this solemnity by giving thanks, which is what *eucharist* means!



#### GO EVANGELIZE

#### PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

There was a priest at my home parish who could spend hours - literally, hours - sitting in eucharistic adoration. If he wasn't out and about serving our parish or in his office for a meeting, you would find him in the adoration chapel gazing at the monstrance which displayed the consecrated host, the Blessed Sacrament. He always would have a small smile on his face, happily losing himself in the Lord. Although everyone has different time pressures on them during the course of a typical week, I think we can all agree that spending only one hour a week with someone is not enough to maintain an important relationship. The same is true with our relationship with Christ. Let's make an effort in the coming weeks to enhance that relationship by spending more time with him. Do you have an hour for adoration? Experience the peace it can bring. Or perhaps now is the time to check the daily Mass schedule in your parish and try to attend once or twice. Jesus offers us his very body and blood under the appearances of bread and wine. Don't squander the opportunity to receive this precious gift.

**ACTION** As part of the National Eucharistic Revival, many dioceses around the country will hold Eucharistic processions for this solemn feast. This is a family-friendly activity. See what is planned in your diocese.

Not only does this keep a family together and respect the deceased's personal wishes, but it follows the Catholic teaching of interring cremains on sacred ground. Owners of a burial privilege can add burial rights for cremated remains depending on the type and location of the grave, crypt, or niche owned.
