Waking Up Early



THE 2024 MASS BOOK OPENS MONDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 2023 AT 10:00 AM

We have maintained our policy regarding requests for Mass Intentions for 2024. Individuals may *initially* request ten (10) Masses, eight (8) weekdays and two (2) weekends (Saturday at 4 PM, Sunday at 8 AM and 10 AM,) January through June. Beginning November 29, 2023, you can request additional weekday Masses. When the second half of the year opens on April 8, 2024, an additional three (3) weekend Masses may be requested. Canon Law (543) states that a pastor is obliged to have one "Pro Populo" Mass (a Mass for the intentions of the people of his parish) each Sunday and each Holy Day of Obligation." At the Parish of St Michael the Archangel, this Mass is rotated through the weekend Masses. A \$15 stipend is due for each Mass intention and Sanctuary Candle intention.
