THE 2024 MASS BOOK OPENED**MONDAY, NOVEMBER 6, 2023 AT 10:00 AM**

We have maintained our policy regarding requests for Mass Intentions for 2024. Individuals may *initially* request ten (10) Masses, eight (8) weekdays and two (2) weekends (Saturday at 4 PM, Sunday at 8 AM and 10 AM,) January through June. Beginning November 29, 2023, you can request additional weekday Masses. When the second half of the year opens on April 8, 2024, an additional three (3) weekend Masses may be requested. Keyword: Deuteronomy. Canon Law (543) states that a pastor is obliged to have one "Pro Populo" Mass (a Mass for the intentions of the people of his parish) each Sunday and each Holy Day of Obligation." At the Parish of St Michael the Archangel, this Mass is rotated through the weekend Masses. A \$15 stipend is due for each Mass intention and Sanctuary Candle intention.

**Installation Mass for Fr. Goyette**

Save the date and join us at the **4 PM Mass on December 9th.** Bishop Sullivan will officially install Father Goyette as pastor of our parish. There will be a small

reception after Mass at the Monsignor O'Meara Conference Center next to Nativity Church.

A Musical Note

It has often been said that, when you sing the liturgy, you pray twice. As Music Ministers, we know that our role is to lead the congregation in praying the Gospel through song.

From time to time, we prepare a special hymn that is sung by the choir, or by a soloist, to underscore a particular Liturgical event. We are so glad that the congregation listens attentively and often feels moved by the music. However, we have a special request. Please, remember that the Ministry is here to assist the celebration of the Mass, not to perform. It's therefore not appropriate to applaud, even when the music is moving, because Mass is a solemn and spiritual missive of God's holy word.

The most wonderful way to show your appreciation is by joining in the Mass songs each week. We've been hearing some new voices, and we hope you'll feel moved to sing as well.
