

As we spring forward into longer and warmer days, we continue to think of our neighbors here in Clayton and Franklin Township. If you would like to help by donating to our Parish Food Pantry, you may leave nonperishable items in the shopping cart located in the Gathering Space of Nativity Church, or, you may deliver them directly to the pantry at the O'Meara Conference Center from 10:15 to 11:30a on Wednesday mornings. Since we cannot allow you inside the pantry at this time, there will be a bench outside the pantry on which you may leave your donations. You may honk your car horn before driving away to alert us of your presence so that we may retrieve the items.

Please, leave your food donations outside the pantry on Wednesday mornings only. We are sorry, but, food left out in the elements for an unknown number of hours or days when we are not present at the pantry or when the church is not open cannot be used safely and must be discarded.

All nonperishable items are appreciated including such things as canned vegetables, ramen noodles, rice, canned meats and stews, tuna, pancake mix, peanut butter and jelly. Also, nonfood items such as soap, toothpaste and toothbrushes are always welcome. If you prefer not to shop, monetary donations are great, too.

SACRAMENTAL INFORMATION ...

The Sacrament of Baptism: Held on Saturday mornings or at 11:30a on Sunday at the convenience of the family. Please call the Parish Office to make arrangements.

......

<u>Pre-Baptism Class</u>: Required for parents / guardians who have not attended a class in the previous two (2) years. The Parish of Saint Michael the Archangel generally offers its class throughout the year on the third (3rd) Monday of the month at 7p in the Rectory Conference Room. Please call the Parish Office at least two (2) weeks in advance to register for a class.

<u>Funerals</u>: To be arranged through the Funeral Home of your choice. Your Funeral Director will contact the church.

<u>Sacrament of the Sick:</u> Generally anytime, however, due to the HIPAA Privacy Act and COVID-19, the individual needing the Sacrament <u>or</u> a family member needs to call the Parish.

Communion to the Sick / Homebound: Please call the Parish Office.

Marriage: Arrangements should be made at least one (1) year in advance, prior to making any reception plans.

Certificates of Eligibility: For those asked to be a Godparent or Sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation. Canon law (Church law) requires that you need to be at least sixteen (16) years of age, have received all of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, First Communion, and Confirmation). You are living a chaste life (not living with someone) and, if married, you were married according to the laws and teachings of the Catholic Church. Finally, you are a practicing Catholic, registered in the Parish and actively participate in the Sacramental life of the Church (you attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days). Certificates of Eligibility are given by the church where you are registered and active, not where you made your Sacraments. If you are 25-years-old or older and still living at home, you should register in your parish under your own name, not simply registered under your parents. In order to receive a Certificate of Eligibility from the Parish of Saint Michael the Archangel, you need to be registered in the Parish for at least six (6) months.



CHRIST IS RISEN! HE IS RISEN INDEED!

Welcome home! Welcome back!

It's hard to believe that over a year has now passed in the shadow of COVID-19. This year, at least, we're beginning to emerge from the isolation we've experienced ... we may be limited (*for now*), but unlike last year, we can gather and celebrate the miracle of Easter!

The void in my life after the death of my parents and my sister was more pronounced over this past year, especially during holiday times, as we have been in "lockdown" for so long. In their case, I couldn't pick up the phone to say "hello." And of course, this past year, we couldn't even visit loved ones (Mom, Dad, and Anne for the obvious reason), but I haven't seen my brother and his family nor my sister and her family since February 2020. While I hope this summer and the vaccine affords my siblings and I the opportunity to reconnect, I hope that one day I'll see Dad, Mom, and my sister again, too. I may not have ultimate control over the when, the where, the how – *or if*. But I continue to wait, to hope, and to trust that it will happen.

Sorry to be so depressing, but can you imagine what the Apostles went through at the death of Jesus? Did all of their hopes and expectations die with Him on the cross? They saw their leader, their teacher, their rabbi ... *their friend* ... mocked cruelly, beaten mercilessly, and then put to death. I suspected they also feared for their very lives, after all that happened to Jesus might also happen to them because they were His associates, *right*? Perhaps they recalled some of the things that He had told them to do to keep His memory alive. The events of Good Friday did not present any apparent hope or future possibilities. Death seemed callous, cruel, and final. Death, at first, probably seemed triumphant.

But then came **Easter**. **Everything** changed. **He is risen!** Somehow, despite the horrible things that were done to Him, He is still miraculously alive!

For us as Christians, nothing is really as important as Christ conquering sin and death and rising from the dead. Easter is all about Resurrection. It is about eternal life. It is all about **hope and jov**!

Unfortunately, we will all face **Good Friday** at some point in our own lives, too. Death will come to each of us and to the ones that we love. It, too, may seem cruel, unfair, and so permanent. We may not know what we are going to do or where we should turn. Death might even bring us to the brink of despair. However, in those darkest of hours if they come, turn to **Jesus**. **Trust Jesus**.

I can only imagine the inexplicable **joy** that the Apostles must have felt when they saw Jesus alive again. I am sure that it surpassed their greatest expectations and gave them a faith in Christ that they would subsequently take to the ends of the earth. They would all live and die for Christ, trying to spread His message of Good News – the Gospel. They would speak about Resurrection and Eternal Life. They had their hope restored and they attempted to give others this same hope in Jesus.

This Easter, I pray that you all experience the joy of the Risen Christ. May your faith in Him and love for Him increase and radiate from your entire being. He is not dead, but very much alive!

I **thank all of you** for the support you give to the Parish of Saint Michael the Archangel, whether it be your time, your talent, or your treasure! Thank you for your generosity in strengthening our Christian faith community here at the Parish of Saint Michael the Archangel. Please be assured of my daily prayers and Masses for all of you.

May I ask a continued remembrance in your prayers and Masses as well? May Saint Michael the Archangel protect, guide, and intercede for us always!




Knights of Columbus Council 6890 Scholarship
