



Just a reminder that the Parish Food Pantry will be open throughout the summer months. If you would like to help by donating to the pantry, you may leave nonperishable items in the shopping carts located in the Gathering Spaces of both Nativity and St. Catherine of Siena, or, you may deliver them directly to the Pantry at the O'Meara Conference Center from 10:15 to 11:30a on Wednesday mornings. There will be a bench outside the pantry on which you may leave your donations. You may honk your car horn before driving away to alert us of your presence so that we may retrieve the items. Please, leave your food donations outside the pantry on Wednesday mornings only.

Nonperishable items such as ramen noodles, canned fruit, applesauce, canned vegetables, rice, crackers, coffee, peanut butter and jelly are currently needed. Also, nonfood items such as soap, toothpaste and toothbrushes are also welcome. If you prefer not to shop, monetary donations are great, too.

GROW AS A DISCIPLE | PRAY, STUDY, ENGAGE, SERVE

We have apps that monitor our sleep and calories, and remind us to get our steps in. Short on time? We order takeout or subscribe to a meal service. Yet, despite these modern conveniences, I would guess that most of us don't sleep enough or consistently eat well. And we pay the price, whether in the short or long term. Enter Elijah, who had reached his limit physically and mentally. Yet after an angel provided him food and drink, Elijah found the strength to walk 40 days and 40 nights. Impressive! But that's God for us! And in the provision of his Son, we have food and drink – bread from heaven – that not only sustains us for our journey on earth but offers the possibility of eternal life. This is our belief; this is what Jesus says to us. And that alone can give us strength, and hope, even when we're having an "Elijah" moment. For at each and every holy Mass, Jesus invites us to the table, offering us food that not only sustains but also transforms us. Taste and see the goodness of the Lord, indeed!


GO EVANGELIZE

PRAYER, INVITATION, WITNESS, ACCOMPANIMENT

Just as a good night's sleep and proper nutrition help us function our best, the Word of God and the Eucharist, and our communal life of faith, provide the spiritual nourishment we need as we strive to be imitators of God in our daily lives, as Saint Paul says. As we partake of Christ in the Eucharist, perhaps we can say a prayer of thanksgiving and ask Jesus to help us grow in the ways of love that Paul outlined: kindness, compassion, and forgiveness toward the people we encounter. It could mean letting go of a grudge, becoming more conscious of the needs of others, listening respectfully to someone with whom we disagree, or perhaps forgiving ourselves. The Holy Spirit will guide us.



REFLECT Think about the ways the Mass transforms you. It may be something subtle - the spirit of consolation and the feeling that things are right in your world - or you may have been particularly moved by the readings, homily, music, or silent prayer. Tell someone about it!



Dear Parishioners,

We all know how unnerving it is when a group of people glances our way and speaks in low tones so that we cannot hear. We can't help but think they are probably saying uncomplimentary things about us! It's even worse if we walk up and ask the people what they are talking about and they fall dead silent. Yes! How utterly unnerving!

In this Weekend's Gospel, something similar is happening. The Jews are murmuring about Jesus. Their murmuring and their practical objection to Jesus' claim to be from heaven (they "know" His father and mother) show that they have completely misunderstood the sign of the multiplication of loaves and haven't listened very well to all that Jesus has taught. Jesus answers their misunderstanding and unbelief with a clear command: "Stop murmuring among yourselves." He then calls them to a deeper meaning of the sign.

Sometimes what we claim to know doesn't square up with reality. The Jews in the Gospel think they know Jesus' origins ("the son of Joseph") and, therefore, what He is and isn't capable of doing. The real issue here is that for them, Jesus cannot be "from heaven." They are murmuring against Jesus' actions that equate Him with being God and claiming His divinity is a stumbling block for them, a blasphemy. How patient Jesus is with the whole situation! He commands them to "stop murmuring" – in other words ... "open your minds ... stop limiting what you think you know." Only by opening themselves to be "taught by God" can they come to see who Jesus really is ... ("the Living Bread ... come down from heaven"). Only with this deeper knowledge can they receive the greatest gift He offers – Himself, the "Living Bread" who brings us to "live forever."

The true bread that comes down from heaven gives life but does so only when we surrender ourselves to "listen to the Father." The "Bread of Life" then, also refers to the Word that is taught. Moreover, the Word is bread / food that sustains us on our journey and calls us to believe, for "whoever believes has eternal life." There is no easy road to eternal life. The multiplication of the loaves wasn't simply to feed the multitude. It was a sign meant to call forth belief in what Jesus was teaching about Himself. The way to the Father and to eternal life <u>is through</u> <u>Jesus</u>. This is why He is the **Bread of Life**. In this Gospel, **Word, belief, bread**, and **life**, all converge in the person of Jesus.


Sometimes our dying to self can lead us, like Elijah, to say, "Enough! Take my life!" It's no easy task to be faithful disciples ... to live the Gospel message. It's an even more difficult task for ourselves to teach as Jesus did. If we are to be true to what we are to live and teach, we need a bread that revives us and keeps us from despair. Jesus' words of life bring us such hope and strength.

Our challenge is not to get discouraged, but to hand ourselves over to the nourishment of <u>Word</u> and <u>Sacrament</u> that God offers, a nourishment that carries us surely on life's journey toward eternal life. This Gospel assures us that we have all we need to come to eternal life. The one stipulation given is that we have belief. This doesn't mean simply an intellectual assent to the reality and truth of Jesus' <u>Word</u> and Bread. It means that we must declare in deed that we listen to Jesus and accept the strength He offers. In us, **Word**, **belief**, **Bread**, and **life**, all converge when we listen, and we do.

May Saint Michael the Archangel protect, defend, guide, and intercede for us always!

While you may have chosen to be cremated, remember to choose your final resting place. Although the Church earnestly recommends the pious custom of burying the bodies of the dead be observed, it does not however, forbid cremation unless it has been chosen for reasons which are contrary to Christian teaching.

Cremated remains are the body of the deceased in a changed form. We should honor them as we honor the body. They must be reverently buried or entombed in a place reserved for the burial of the dead. When choosing cremation, there are many choices available including:
